An event for Parent carers of young people with Special Educational Needs or Disability up to the age of 25 with a Statements or Education Health Care Plan.

These sessions will explain the Preparing for Adulthood legislation which states that young people should be supported to exercise choice and control over their lives using the 4 'preparing for adulthood' outcomes:

Independent living, Employment, Having friends and relationships, being part of their communities, being as healthy as possible

For information, the DCC policy is that they will only support and fund Post 18 education provision if it is deemed that the young person's special education need means that they need longer in education to achieve their agreed outcomes (as stated in their EHCP).
