


Patterns

Explain how to make a pattern, and do your own example, they can be as simple or as complex as you would like.

Find a selection of objects with similar colours in your house or garden, and see what repeating patterns you can make.

Here are some examples of things we found in our house:



Once you have mastered this task, try making up your own patterns! Draw the first three or four colours or shapes in the pattern so that your child can continue them →

Other things you could make patterns with:

- Daisies and pinecones
- Different shaped blocks (pattern in a tower form)
- Cutlery
- Snacks
- Get creative! 😊

Remember, it's easier to learn a pattern if the objects you are using are exactly the same rather than having little differences. For example, if you use cars – it is probably easier to learn a pattern if the cars are the same.

When there is a bit more of an understanding, you could use different shaped cars that are the same colour for your patterns.
