Beaucroft Post-16 Centre 'The Burrow' is situated in a separate building within the school grounds. It is equipped to deliver a life-skills and employment based curriculum. It currently caters for up to four classes of students between the age of sixteen and nineteen. The students will generally have severe/complex learning difficulties, vulnerability and/or ASD. Priorities for learning will be determined by individual need and set by the teacher in consultation with the student, parents and other professionals.

The Post-16 Centre at Beaucroft provides a student-centred approach to teaching and learning which enables the student to successfully progress through the Post-16 Centre and on to their chosen post school provision in preparation for the transition to adulthood. We provide a well-planned programme of activities to help them develop the skills to make informed decisions as best as they can about their future.

The key aspects of the curriculum are from the Preparing for Adulthood Outcomes: Community Inclusion, Developing and Maintaining Relationships, Developing Routes to Employment, Learning Independent Living Skills and Having an Active and Healthy Lifestyle.



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Curriculum in Post-16

Over the course of three years the students complete a Diploma in Skills for Further Learning and Employment at Entry Levels and, where appropriate, take qualifications at Entry Levels in English and Maths. They learn to develop skills necessary to function to the best of their ability in all aspects of life. Work experience, work shadowing, enterprise skills and college links will take place at various times throughout the year. All students will take part in the management and running of our business 'Sweet 16' – our tuck shop, 'Burrows Bistro' and RAFA – our cafés, and the making and selling of arts and crafts. These enterprises develop skills in stock taking, serving customers, money work and using tools and machinery to create crafts. Students are encouraged to discuss their aspirations and set their own life (short and long term) goals. Students will be expected to take responsibility for the planning and evaluation of some of their own learning activities including fitness, diet and health, leisure and travel training activities. They will be encouraged to be aware of the world around them and the impact it has on their lives. The students also have the opportunity to work towards achieving their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award.
