Beaucroft School Art Overview

Topic Knowledge

Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes.

Begin to show accuracy and care when drawing. Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function. Share their creations, explaining the process they have used.

Skills Progression

Explore different materials freely, to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make. Develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them. Join different materials and explore different textures.

Create shapes – to use to represent objects. Increase complexity and detail, e.g. facial features. Use drawing to represent ideas e.g. movement/ noise.

Show different emotions in drawings and paintings,. Explore colour and colour mixing. Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express ideas and feelings.

Build on previous learning, refining and developing

Pupils will have experienced drawing techniques. They will show developing skill and control with a range of drawing and painting materials. Pupils will have used a range of materials to design and make products including craft, weaving, printmaking, sculpture and clay. Pupils will use their preferred method of communication to describe their artwork.

Pupils will have explored new drawing and painting techniques with greater skill and control. Pupils will have used an increased range of materials and techniques, e.g. tie dying, sewing, mixed media, photomontages, printing techniques, digital art and 3D sculptures.

Pupils will create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas; to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials; about great artists, architects and designers in history.

Pupils will develop their creativity and ideas, and increase proficiency in their execution. They should develop a critical understanding of artists, architects and designers, expressing reasoned judgements that can inform their own work. Pupils will use a range of techniques to record their observations as a basis for exploring their ideas to use a range of techniques and media, including painting to increase their proficiency in the handling of different materials to analyse and evaluate their own work, and that of others, in order to strengthen the visual impact or applications of their work about the history of art, craft, design and architecture, including periods, styles and major movements from ancient times up to the present day.
