Have <u>two options.</u> By December, apply for their next placement. Monitor the Local Authority Funding Panel Decision (Phone SEND case manager). 	 Consider legal deputyship/power of attorney. Age 16-17 contact the local authority transition planning team – care act 2014 assessment.
