Specialist Educational Placements - focus on continuing education to develop specialist skills or to provide additional help for a learning and/or physical disability. These options can be costly and often require funding from the local authority. Therefore, it is useful to visit and establish whether a specialist placement is the best option to meet a young person's needs for a future placement.

 - 1) [The STEPS Programme](#) - specifically aimed at young people between the ages of 16-24 with moderate to severe learning difficulties. The course provides students with the opportunity to complete practical classroom-based activities alongside volunteering whilst also developing their skills in English and Maths. The STEPs course is aimed at preparing students to progress onto other courses or volunteering/employment.
 - 2) [Pre-vocational Programme](#) - A one-year course aimed at school leavers with moderate learning difficulties and additional needs. The programme offers students the opportunity to take part in voluntary work, gain qualifications and more independence in preparation for future employment. The programme also offers a possible progression to a second and third year depending on individual circumstances.

[The Continuing Education Course](#) – A first year course aimed at school leavers from ages 16 through to 19 to support them with the transition from School to College. Learners will work towards a certificate in either Personal Social Development or Vocational Studies with the view of moving onto employment or further study, such as the Level 1 Diploma in Vocational Studies or STTEPS Course also offered by the Foundation Learning Department.

- **SWRAC (South West Regional Assessment Centre)** - A local Training Provider based in Wimborne with educational settings in Boscombe, Dorchester and Weymouth offering courses aimed at those with special educational needs and learning difficulties (SEND), and/or those who are educated outside of mainstream provision.
 - [The Pathways Course](#) - A course aimed at young people with SEND. Learners will complete 12 weeks on the Pathways course and then progress onto either the (1) Prep for Life or (2) Prep for Work module. The Pathways Course plus either option 1 or 2 will create a one-year educational programme aimed at preparing learners for an apprenticeship, further study at College or employment.
 - [Get into Work](#) - A Supported Internship aimed at preparing learners for employment. Suitability of learners for the Supported Internship is determined through the Pathways course. For students with SEN and an EHCP, Supported Internships can be a good alternative to an Apprenticeship.

Supported Internships prepare young people for employment and accessing the workplace in a similar way to an Apprenticeship but with additional support to meet their needs. Please see here for more information about Supported Internships:
